# PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2011/2012

I cannot believe that it has been a year passed since the last AGM it seems like only last week we were all excited about the AGM and the new year ahead. A lot has happened in the last twelve months, some not so good and much positive.

I am delighted to see the building works underway and the new pits to the northern end now complete save and except some cosmetic and safety matters which will be attended to shortly. We hope that work will start about August on the southern pits and when completed we will see a great improvement on both areas especially when the safety fences are installed. Plans are still afoot for the central area however funds and funding arrangements will need to be reviewed in light of the recent turn of events with theft at the field.

Regrettable we have seen on three separate occasion's theft at the field including cars being broken into and money and goods stolen and twice the equipment shed has been burglarised with sundry small items being stolen and more recently the quad bike used to tow the mower stolen. Overall we have lost over \$10,000.00 worth of equipment but this has been replaced under insurance with the quad bike shortly to be replaced.

Notwithstanding our insurance cover we have had to pay an excess and the premium will increase next year given our claims. With this in mind the committee has turned its attention to security at the field and we must embark on a road to ensure that not only is our equipment safe but more importantly our members. Discussion on this subject will take place at the club meeting before decisions are made to spend monies in this direction.

On a more positive note this last year has seen an influx of new members and I for one have seen Saturdays become far busier for training and general flying and am delighted to see younger people now joining the club. The advent of the ARF and RTF models (perhaps to the derision of the traditional modeller) has seen a vast increase in the numbers and diversity of models now seen at the field including the ever popular foam meat trays, which are becoming more realistic in their finish and flying. Sadly events such as the traditional and once extremely popular F4C scale competitions and scale generally as well as aerobatics, combat and perhaps to a lesser extent pylon are seeing a decline in popularity. Perhaps this may change but I believe that as most members are cash rich and time poor these traditional areas of the hobby may suffer ever decreasing popularity.

AWA currently hold the land lease, however WAMASC are the club responsible for the development to the site. Members are concerned this may have implications with any KAMS lotteries commission grants. We would also like to know why the grant is 30,000.00 for one year (we thought it was \$15,000.00 per year).
