The Missing Mower Man Checks In

Well not really missing except in the eyes of Frank Jensen who has had to step into the breach while I am doing the "Grey Nomad" thing.

Wandering around "Aus" has had its interesting findings but none more so than coming across (unexpectedly) the "Museum of Australian Army Flying" at the Army flight training base at Oakey (NSW).

What a great museum, probably one of the best I have come across. It is only small and is actually an official Army unit. The focus is on presenting the history of flight within the Australian Army from 1912 through to today. The aircraft on display range from the Army's first foray with a Bristol Boxkite in 1912/1913 through WWI to today in Afghanistan. The aircraft include the Bristol Boxkite, Bristol F2B, Deperdussin, Bleriot XI, Auster Mk III, Auster AOP.9, Winjeel, Cessina Birddog, Nomad, Caribou plus a range of helicopters used in Korea, Vietnam through to today's rotary aircraft user in the middle east.

A number of the older aircraft are obviously replicas but even so the museum has ensured that they are authentic in all aspects as possible. The greater majority of the aircraft on display are actual airframes that were employed by the Army. These include both fixed wing and rotary. Once a type of unit is phased out of operations, the Army allocates at least one of the type to the Museum.

Two aircraft included in the museum are not pasted operational types used, but are there because of their significance to the Army's history. The first is a replica of a Fokker DR1 Triplane that was flown by Baron Von Richthofen. Much is covered on the Baron's demise and the role the Aussies were reputed to have played in his final down fall.

The other aircraft is a Boomerang. Although not specifically utilised by the Army, this particular aircraft was "dumped" on the Army after WWII. The airframe was later sold to a local farmer for parts where is sat for some time under covers until acquired by Guido Zuccoli who flew Boomerangs during WWII. The aircraft was later rebuilt to flight worthiness and flown over Darwin in 1992. Eventually the aircraft was donated back to the Army museum. The Boomerang is not flown today but could easily be made flight worthy again.

Also within the museum is history and artifacts that relate to the Army and aviation since 1912. This also includes details and the medals of the only army aviator to receive the Victor Cross during WWI. Lieutenant Frank McNamara received the award for landing his aircraft behind enemy lines to rescue a downed pilot comrade.



The museum is exceptionally presented and is well worth the visit if you should have the opportunity.
